## TIGERLILY FOUNDATION LAUNCHES SEASON 4 OF BREATHE TV WITH PARTNER BLACKDOCTOR.ORG

ALDIE, VA (April 10, 2024) – <u>Tigerlily Foundation</u>, a leading cancer patient advocacy organization, founded by 18-year breast cancer survivor Maimah Karmo, is proud to launch the fourth season of <u>BREATHE Tv</u>, an educational and support video series for women on their cancer journey.

BREATHE Tv is a space for inspirational and educational videos that bring patients, providers, and families together to engage in meaningful conversations about cancer, women's health, and women's lifestyles. BREATHE Tv season four consists of 14 episodes covering various topics such as *Understanding Triple Negative Breast Cancer (TNBC), Living with Cervical Cancer, Survivorship: Life with Cancer*, and more.

"We are thrilled to embark on the fourth season of BREATHE Tv, continuing our mission to educate and empower women on their cancer journeys," shared Maimah Karmo, Founder of Tigerlily Foundation. "This series is about survival and also about thriving - together, at every stage of your life, healthcare, and cancer journey. At Tigerlily, we are fostering a community that uplifts and supports each other. Each day we hear powerful patient stories and we deeply understand the importance of these discussions early and often."

Through the support of partners like Merck, Takeda, Genentech, and Gilead, Tigerlily Foundation delivers a valuable educational resource that supports women on their cancer journeys. The 14 episodes from season four contribute to a growing educational archive of 45 episodes that includes a BREATHE Tv 3-part listening summit.

Earlier this month, Tigerlily Foundation began its partnership with <u>BlackDoctor.org</u> for a second year. BDO is the world's largest online health resource specifically targeted to African Americans. The BREATHE Tv After Show will feature special guest Dr. Renee Matthews from BDO and will follow right after the BREATHE Tv episode on Facebook Live. Dr. Matthews will deepen the conversation with guests from each episode and further discuss topics from her medical perspectives and through the lens of BDO Black culture.

"It is in the BREATHE Tv After Show that we dive a bit deeper into the lived experiences of the guests, topics discussed in the episode through the lens of Black culture and health as it relates to cancers that impact women," shared Dr. Renee Matthews.
