

ANGEL Lashelle Scott has been featured by the American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network.

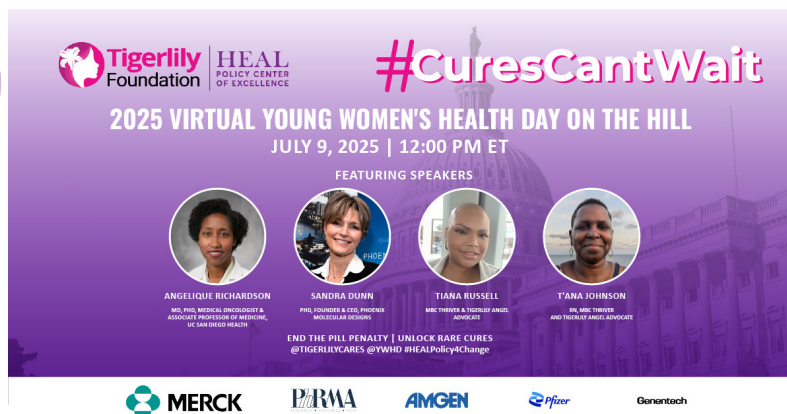


In this powerful video, Lashelle shares how being part of a clinical trial gave her hope — and why representation is not just important, but essential.

The Negative Impact of the 340B Program to Patients

Have you heard about the 340B program? It's the "little" known program causing big problems for patients. Even though this program is the second-largest government healthcare program (second only to Medicare Part D), most people have never heard of it.

The 340B program, created in 1992, is meant to help hospitals and clinics serving low-income, uninsured, and underinsured patients access life-saving medications at discounted prices. These savings are meant to go directly to patients—lowering drug costs, funding critical services, and expanding access to cancer care, mental health support, and chronic disease management.

But right now, **corporate greed is hijacking the system**. Some hospitals and for-profit entities are exploiting 340B discounts to boost revenue—**not patient care**. This means:

- 🏠 Patients pay more while hospitals pocket savings.
- 📋 No transparency on how discounts are used.
- 👤 Underserved communities left behind as providers chase profits.

Tigerlily, along with our ANGEL Advocates, are calling for accountability. 340B savings must go where they belong—to the patients who need them most.

“There's got to be a way for 340B to be more transparent. Hopefully we're working towards that happening but it should happen sooner than later because a lot of people are suffering while waiting for the fix.”

As we move into summer, we're reflecting on the incredible progress this community continues to drive on Capitol Hill and in statehouses across the country. Thanks to your tireless advocacy, we've celebrated **several federal wins this month**:

- **The ORPHAN Cures Act** was included in the Budget Reconciliation Package
- **The EPIC Act** was reintroduced with bicameral and bipartisan support
- **The Access to Breast Cancer Diagnosis Act** was reintroduced in both the House and Senate
- **The SCREENS for Cancer Act** returned in the Senate
- **The Clinical Trial Modernization Act** was reintroduced in the House
- At the state level, **more than 60 ANGEL Advocates have taken action**—showing up, speaking out, and leading on key issues like PDABs, Biomarker Testing, and 340B legislation.

Together, we've sent nearly **3,000 letters** to lawmakers (as of May 24), each one a step toward a more just and equitable healthcare system. This movement is working—because you are. Your voice, your power, and your commitment to health equity is changing the landscape for people across the country. Let's keep the momentum going.
