Newly Introduced Federal Bills to Keep an Eye On

340B PATIENT Act

This recently introduced bill, while designed with the good-willed intention to provide better access to affordable drugs for patients, threatens to allow increased misuse and abuse of the 340B program.

The 340B Program is a little-known but big federal program created to provide drug discounts to vulnerable patients and allow for investment by hospitals into charity care and patient support services like financial assistance, community outreach, free screening programs, etc. Instead of benefiting patients, bad actors are misusing and abusing this program to create a profit and line their pockets.

EARLY Act

We are excited to share about the reintroduction of the Education and Awareness Requires Learning Young (EARLY) Act! The EARLY Act is a critical lifeline for young and high-risk women and their providers. When we first championed this legislation in 2009, we knew it would save lives—and it has. The EARLY Act's education campaigns, provider training, and grant programs have empowered women with knowledge and tools to advocate for their breast health, while equipping clinicians to better serve them. But our work isn't done.

The EARLY Act was last reauthorized in December 2020 for five years beginning in 2021 and its authorization will expire by the end of FY2026, during the current 119th session. With disparities persisting—especially for young, Black and other underserved women—we must ensure this vital legislation continues to bridge gaps in awareness, access, and care. Together, we can rewrite the narrative for the next generation, because every woman deserves the chance to live a full life.

New Article Spotlight: Beyond Blood Tests – Why Biomarker Testing Matters

Tigerlily Foundation's founder, Maimah Karmo, shares in Conquer Magazine how biomarker testing can be a game-changer for patients. Biomarkers act like a "lock" on cancer cells, and targeted therapies are the "keys" that can open the door to more effective, personalized treatment options.

But access isn't equal. Too often, patients in communities of color are less likely to receive this critical testing. Maimah calls for equity, education, and advocacy so that every patient can benefit from precision medicine.

Her message is clear: **knowledge is power.** Asking your doctor about biomarker testing could change your care and your future.
