This year's **BEACON Symposium** theme, "From Policy to Practice: Safeguarding Patient Access in a Shifting Landscape" will include panels with experts discussing:





Expanding the MAPCare Study: Now in FL, AL, GA & MS









ANGELs in Action at the Congressional Black Caucus Foundation's 54th Annual Legislative Conference



On September 25th, ANGEL Advocate **Neosho Ponder** proudly represented Tigerlily Foundation at the **Congressional Black Caucus (CBC) Spouses' Annual Community Breakfast** during the 54th Annual Legislative Conference. She was joined by fellow ANGEL Advocate **Dale McElveen** and two inspiring volunteers — breast cancer survivor **Nikki Reeves** and graduate student **Lindsay Washington** — who are both now interested in becoming ANGEL Advocates after learning more about Tigerlily's mission.

Despite the rain moving the event inside historic Shiloh Baptist Church, the day was filled with connection and purpose. Neosho and the team shared Tigerlily resources, built partnerships, and had meaningful conversations — including with students from Howard University's School of Dentistry, who were shocked to learn how many young women must advocate for mammograms before age 40.

Later that day at the Washington Convention Center, she participated in a CBCF ALC Author's Panel, God's Got Jokes: His Timing is Perfect, along with 2 other panelists and a moderator. She discussed her memoir that inspired the panel's title, God's Got Jokes: How I Used My Faith and God's Humor to Survive Breast Cancer. She shared her story of surviving breast cancer through faith and humor, while also issuing a call-to-action: for everyone to advocate for themselves and their loved ones when it comes to health. She also highlighted Tigerlily's work to address disparities and invited attendees to join the movement.

STAT Summit 2025 Recap!



At this year's STAT Summit in Boston, Tigerlily Foundation's President & CEO **Maimah Karmo** joined a dynamic panel on Bridging Gaps in Gynecologic Cancer Care. She was joined by **Dr. Ginger J. Gardner** (Memorial Sloan Kettering, Foundation for Women's Cancer) and **Leslie Amendola** (Genmab), with the discussion moderated by **Jesse McQuarters** of STAT News.


Maimah shared both her personal breast cancer journey and Tigerlily's mission, highlighting the systemic barriers women face—from diagnosis through treatment—and the urgent need to center equity, access, and patient voices. Through advocacy, partnerships, and equity-driven research, Tigerlily works every day to eliminate these barriers and empower women across their cancer journeys. The conversation underscored that real change requires collaboration across advocates, clinicians, industry, and policymakers—ensuring women are supported beyond medicine.



Tigerlily in the Media Driving Health Equity Through Data: New Publication on MBC Care

We are proud to announce that Tigerlily Foundation Founder and CEO, Maimah Karmo, co-authored a compelling new analysis with Komodo Health: "How New ADCs Are Reshaping Metastatic Breast Cancer Care." The publication, which leverages Komodo's real-world data, explores the rapid adoption of Antibody-Drug Conjugates (ADCs) in metastatic breast cancer. While the findings show progress toward racial equity in precision medicine (with Black women showing the highest ADC treatment rate), they also uncover an urgent disparity for older patients (age 66+), who receive treatment at significantly lower rates and experience longer delays. This powerful collaboration underscores Tigerlily's commitment to turning real-world data into actionable policy insights to ensure all young women, regardless of age or background, receive equitable and timely care.

Unlocking the Conversation: Navigating ESR1 Mutations in Metastatic Breast Cancer

In this article authored by Tigerlily's President & CEO, **Maimah Karmo**, **Nicole A. Colwell**, MD and **Eleonora Teplinsky**, MD, they address the evolving role of ESR1 mutations in metastatic breast cancer — mutations in the estrogen receptor gene that can influence treatment response. She emphasizes that:

ESR1 mutations emerge as a key mechanism of resistance to endocrine therapies.

- Understanding and testing for these mutations is critical for personalizing treatment strategies, particularly for patients whose cancer has progressed despite hormone-based treatments.
- Clinicians and patients alike need to engage in open dialogues about the implications of ESR1 mutations — how they impact prognosis, treatment selection, and potential clinical trial options.
- The article champions patient advocacy and education as central to ensuring people with metastatic breast cancer are empowered to ask the right questions, understand test results, and navigate complex treatment decisions.

By highlighting this cutting-edge area of science alongside real-world patient implications, the piece reinforces Tigerlily's commitment to elevating patient knowledge, promoting equity in access to testing, and driving conversations that shape better outcomes.

Coming Soon: Bladder Cancer Content at Tigerlily


Tigerlily Foundation is expanding its commitment to inclusive, patient-centered education by introducing a new focus area: bladder cancer.




